Important points regarding this year's services

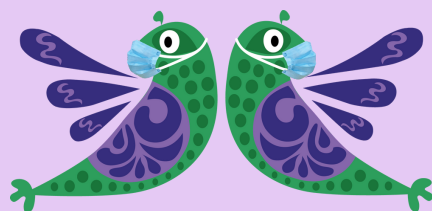
- Masks are required within the building

High Holiday Youth programs

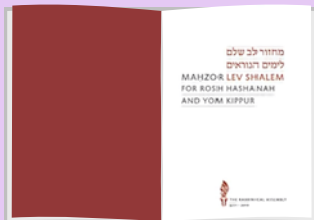
Also... watch for our Religious School "Milkshakes in the Sukkah" on October 4 at 12:30 pm.

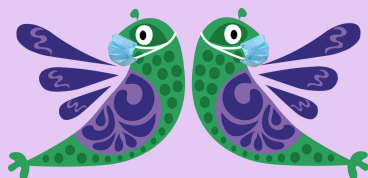
High holiday Prayerbooks



For our holiday services we use the Mahzor Lev Shalem. At the end of the service, please leave on your seats. They will be put away by our custodial staff.

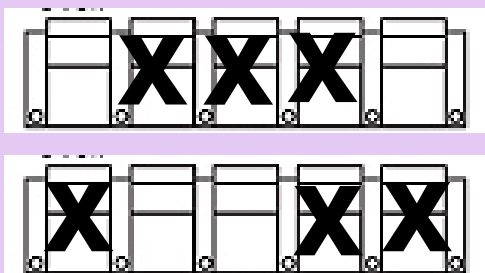
For those who choose to livestream, please be in touch with the office to borrow a Machzor or Siddur for home use. They should be returned after the holidays.

Seating



As we are constantly reviewing the data on infection rates and counts in Nassau county, based on **current information** we plan on some sort of social distanced seating. We expect family groups will sit together with some spacing. **Out of concern for everyone's safety, these plans might change as the holidays are closer.** All services will be held in the expanded Sanctuary and our volunteer ushers will be available to point out available seats. Please be considerate of all.
